

Update on COVID-19 Testing in PPS
Starting in the 2025–2026 school year,
PPS will no longer provide on-site
COVID-19 symptom-based testing.
Students will still be excluded if they
show symptoms listed on the <u>When to</u>
<u>Keep My Child Home From School</u>
chart, and families can continue to
access testing through at-home kits, their
healthcare provider, or <u>PPS School-</u>
Based Health Centers.

School Districts can receive money from Medicaid to help pay for important services like speech, occupational therapy, and counseling provided at school. The Medicaid money helps school districts to keep these resources available for students with disabilities or behavioral health needs without changing the services they receive. This helps PPS get money back from the government for the work our staff is already doing. Because of the current budget situation, this funding is more important than ever. Before PPS can ask Medicaid for money for certain services a student receives at school, we need to inform parents about it. When a student is enrolled in Medicaid, we also need their parent's written permission to bill Medicaid for these services. The parent only has to give permission once, and they can change their mind anytime.

Important things to know for families whose student is enrolled in Medicaid:

 Giving permission will **not** change your student's or family's Medicaid/OHP benefits or reduce

- any money you get from Medicaid or other programs.
- Oregon Health Plan (OHP)
 Coverage is personal Medicaid insurance. It pays for doctor visits, medicine, and other health care outside of school and this will not change.
- School-Based Medicaid helps schools get money from Medicaid for services given at school, like counseling, or speech or occupational therapy in a student's IEP. It does not change a student's or family's personal health insurance or the amount of visits your child can receive outside of school.

In short: OHP is a family's Medicaid coverage, and school-based Medicaid is just a way for schools to get funding for services provided at school. All students will still get the same health services for free, even if the parent doesn't give permission.

What to do next:

All families are asked to review the **Notice of Intent to Bill Medicaid** and complete the Yearly Verification process in **ParentVue** which contains a fillable electronic Consent (find it on the page entitled 'Medicaid Billing Consent'). If you would like to complete a paper Consent, please download one (see **this link** under "Documents") and return the completed form to your School. Your completed and signed Consent will document whether your child is enrolled in Medicaid, and your choice whether to allow Portland Public Schools to bill Medicaid.
