

MEN'S GOLF WINS PIL CHAMPIONSHIP FOR 2ND YEAR IN A ROW

The Wilson Men's Golf Team took 1st Place in the P.I.L. for the second year in a row. This year they were undefeated! Michael Reid (11) finished 2nd in the PIL. Blake Hudson (freshman) finished 3rd in the overall standings of the PIL. In their final match, Wilson shot 329 defeating Cleveland 353 and Franklin 371. In that match, 1st Place went to Carsten Concon 75 from Cleveland, 2nd Place to Michael Reid 77 from Wilson, and 3rd Place to Andrew Sanderson 80 from Wilson. This is Coach Christopher Hudson's third year as the Wilson coach, adding, "so I'd say we are progressing pretty well. I'm proud of how hard they work and how well they listen to instruction regarding swing changes. These swing changes have helped them improve to where they are now."
