Understanding the Forecasting Process with Jessika Magnett - When it happens, how it works and how we can support our students and school community during the process. Q and A following

Most of our meeting was dedicated to this special topic.

Forecasting Process Overview

"Forecasting" is the process by which students request courses for the 2025-26 School Year so that administration can determine need and interest in the course offerings, match teachers and resources to the needs, and create schedules for all. Other considerations during the Forecasting process include, but are not limited to: finalized PPS budgets, teacher contracts, and State requirements for new



curriculum. The Grant HS Website has resources for students, caregivers and families to assist in understanding the process. At this writing the information has not yet been updated to SY 25-26 but the process and requirements are predominately the same. Go to https://www.pps.net/grant and click on the Academics>Course Guides. You can see a pdf version of the guide as well as an Interactive Guide where you can use filters to narrow results. There will be NO printed copies of the 2025-2026 Course Guide – it will be on-line only. The updated Course Guides will be posted to the website by the first week in February.

Schedule

- Rising 8th graders are going through forecasting now with Middle School and Grant HS counselors.
- Incoming students (at all levels) from non-PPS schools must acquire forecasting documents from the Grant counseling department if they have not already done so.
- Forecasting will be on February 4-5 by grade level by having an in-class presentation by the counselors where they will receive instructions and Course Request Worksheets. An updated video presentation will be shown and is also available to parents/caregivers on the GHS Website (Course Requesting at Grant High School). Students will use a paper worksheet to complete their forecasting, bring that worksheet home for parent/guardian review and signature, and then enter their course requests into StudentVue/Synergy. On the scheduled due date they will meet with counselors to review their choices and make any corrections necessary:

Grade	Will Forecast in this class	Will Meet with Counselors on these dates
9 th	Writer's Workshop	February 12-13
10 th	English	February 10-11
11 th	US History	February 6-7

- All forecasting will be due by February 14, 2025.
- Priority will be given to Juniors and Seniors for popular electives, HOWEVER, Jessika
 encourages all students, including 9th and 10th graders, to rank electives that genuinely interest
 them. While placement may be competitive, there's always a possibility of enrollment. The
 advice given "don't put anything on your forecasting worksheet you can't imagine yourself
 being in".
 - Several parents reported students who were assigned electives they had not considered and turned out really liking those classes. 9th graders have the opportunity to defer PE, but for incoming students transitioning from schools outside PPS, PE classes can provide a valuable opportunity to connect with new classmates.


