Six-year-old Ruby Bridges stepped into the history books on November 14, 1960, when she became one of the first students to integrate William Frantz Elementary School in New Orleans, becoming a national icon for the civil rights movement. Today her story continues to inspire the next generation of leaders to end racism together one step at a time. As a reminder, If your students regular after school plan changes, please:

- Communicate changes with their teacher the day before the change if possible.
- Let the front office know when:
 - o It is a change for the same day, and the teacher might not get a message in time
 - It is a long term, and regular change
 - If it will change their bus riding schedule
- If your student attends the neighborhood house after school program and you plan to
 pick them up right after school please consider picking up your student from staff with
 neighborhood house at the cafeteria doors. This helps neighborhood house manage the
 changes and account for students with alternate plans.

We work to try and make the end of day release go as smoothly as possible so knowing plans ahead of time is extremely helpful!

Our annual Scholastic Book Fair is coming December 9-13, 2024! Last year we made just over \$7,000 from the book fair, which earned us \$3,000 in books and materials for our school library! This year our goal is \$8,000 which would give the library \$4,000 to use towards books and materials. My goal this year is to add books and materials to the Library with accessible reading levels while offering high-interest content that will keep students engaged and motivated to read! November Fundraiser with Atlas Pizza November 19, 2024


