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3.40.014-P Emergency Plans And Procedures

A fundamental and high priority obligation of all principals is establishment of procedures and programs, which assure the safety of all personnel in their schools. Therefore, continual and planned programs of education, which apprise students and staff members of safety hazards and of good safety practices shall be conducted not less than 30 minutes each month. Moreover, special plans and procedures required in case of school wide emergencies or other hazardous conditions such as fire, bomb threats or explosions, of violence and natural disasters including storms, or earthquakes, etc. shall be developed in detail. Such plans shall be prepared in consultation with city and county agencies according to the guidelines and requirements established by the superintendent of schools as required by state law and shall be implemented through educational programs and preparedness drills conducted at regular intervals each year. Emergency plans and procedures shall be made available in every school office and other strategic locations throughout the district.
