## **School Improvement**

There will be homework to understand how to achieve the goal of growth and engage the Site Counsil in understanding and achieving those goals.

Goal #1:

By the Fall 2023, the percentage of 1st-5th grade students meeting or exceeding their Math Projected Growth, as measured by the MAP Achievement Status and Growth Summary, will increase from 43.3% (Fall 2018 to Fall 2019) to 65% (Fall 2021 to Fall 2023).

By June of 2022, 65% of 1st-5th grade students will meet their Individual MAP Growth Goal in Reading as determined by the Achievement Status and Growth Summary Chart, increasing from 53% in 2018-2019.

In addition, 80% of Historically Underserved Students will meet their Individual MAP Growth Goal in Reading as determined by the Achievement Status and Growth Summary Chart. Goal #3:

By October of 2022, the percentage of students who "respond favorably" to Teacher-Student Relationships will increase from 50% in the 2018-2019 to 70% in the 2021-2022 School Year as measured by the Successful Schools Survey.
