General Course Description	Students with an IEP get direct instruction and support for interpersonal communication, social skills, social emotional regulation, situation-specific behavior and self-advocacy skills. Executive functioning skills such as organization, time management, future-thinking, and planning are also explicitly taught through modeling and built into classroom routines. Students also receive support for work completion and direct support for academic tasks. Placement in this class is based on SPED eligibility and IEP team feedback.
