
- Gymnasium, music building and boiler room demolished
- Temporary facilities located on site
- Construct new gymnasium and classroom wing, new auditorium and student commons cafeteria
- Former auditorium transforms into new media center

A Campus Transforms

A significant amount of work has already taken place on the \$92 million Roosevelt High School Modernization. The project remains on time and on budget with the first new buildings set to open in the fall of 2016.

Phase 1 Construction Moves Forward

Construction is taking place in phases around the campus over time to minimize the disruption to student learning and impacts on the neighborhood. As part of Phase 1, the gymnasium, music building and boiler room have been demolished. Over the next several months construction will take place on the new gymnasium and classroom wing, new auditorium and the new student commons cafeteria. The former auditorium is being transformed into the new media center.



Temporary Facilities in Place

New temporary classrooms are located on the front lawn. The “ten-plex” will host the math department and SUN/Step Up tutoring. One of the two smaller portables will serve as Social Service offices and the Teen Clothes Closet. The other will be a temporary weight room. PE classes will be held in the new heated tent structure.



Upcoming Construction Phases:




Phase II Construction SUMMER 2016 – SUMMER 2017

- New auditorium, gymnasium, media center and commons cafeteria open in fall of 2016
- Renovate original 1921 buildings for new learning, administrative, and counseling spaces
- Construct second half of student commons
- Temporary facilities remain on site



Phase III Completion SUMMER 2017 – DECEMBER 2017

- All modernized buildings open to students in the fall of 2017
- Existing library, cafeteria wings demolished
- Temporary facilities removed
- Construction fence removed
- Site work and landscaping improvements completed by winter





What This Means for Students and Staff:

Classes will need to move between the existing buildings, temporary classrooms, and the new facility as it is constructed. The project team will be in constant communication with staff to minimize disruption to teachers and students to the extent feasible.

Theater and Performing Arts

For the 2015-16 school year, drama classes will be held in a general education classroom. Performances will take place at locations to be determined. In the fall of 2016, drama and music classes will move into the new theater building.

Sports and PE

For the 2015-16 school year, PE classes will be held in the heated tent structure and interim weight room. Athletics staff is reviewing alternative locations for basketball practice and games for the 2015-16 school year. Please consult with your coach for the latest information. In the fall of 2016, the new gymnasium building will open and all gym-based sports will have their new home.

The football field and track will remain open during construction. However, there will be some impacts - construction fencing will restrict access to the entrance off N. Burr Avenue. Bathrooms in the grandstand will be inaccessible, but there will be portable toilets north of the concession stand. The training room and first aid supplies will be relocated to the concessions shed.

Baseball, tennis, and softball will be impacted for the full two-year construction period. Please consult with your coach for the latest information on practice and game locations.

Student Health Center

The Roosevelt Campus School-Based Health Center is now in a state-of-the-art mobile health services unit that is located next to the new PE tent behind the library. The clinic hours are: Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday: 7:45 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. Tuesday, 9:45 a.m. to 5:45 p.m. The clinic number is (503) 988-3909.

School Assemblies

For the 2015-16 school year, assemblies will be held in the cafeteria. Once completed, the gymnasium can house student assemblies for a total enrollment of 1700.

Access Points


