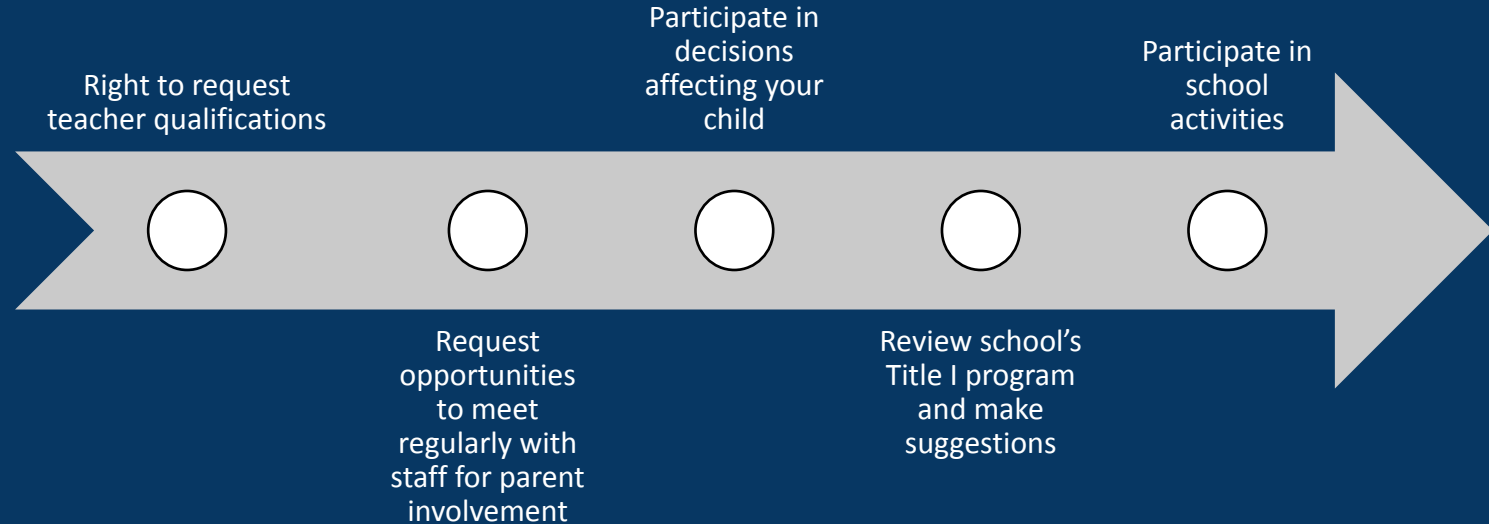

What is Title I-A?

- Title I-A is the United States government largest education assistance program for schools
- Funds are used to provide programs that support students who are struggling in reading and math
- Funding provided under ESEA (Elementary and Secondary Education Act) the nation's national education law and longstanding commitment to equal opportunity for all students
